## Weekly Letter – 10 August 2025

Luke 12:32-40

#### Be prepared!

In this week's passage from Luke there is the encouragement to be prepared for Jesus' return and there are two parables: the first is about slaves being ready for the return of their master from a wedding banquet – if he finds them ready he will serve them a meal; the second says that if a houseowner was ready for the thief, he wouldn't have been burgled. The first sounds like a positive reward, the second sounds like it is based on fear. Maybe this 'being prepared' was more significant for the first Christians, expectant for Jesus' return or in fear of persecution?

When we hear 'Be Prepared' perhaps there are echoes of it being one of the Scouting mottoes — being ready to do your duty of helping others 'and also by having thought out beforehand any accident or situation that might occur, so that you *know* the right thing to do at the right moment, and are willing to do it.' For Guides there was also the suggestion to have things in your pockets to carry shopping, entertain a small child and money to make a call from a phone box. Baden Powell presented 'being prepared' as a mixture of readiness, risk assessment and having resources to hand.

So are we to hear 'Be Prepared' as being in a constant state readiness, which could lead to anxiety (and there are plenty of Christians who will see the next war or famine or spread of disease as a sign of the end of the world), or is it a reference to a belief which has become less significant over 2,000?

Perhaps we can navigate these dilemmas better by understanding 'Be Prepared' as 'Be Aware!' Be aware that God is with us, within us, and all around us, and that remains true whatever happens, so we do not need to live in a heightened state of worry. Be aware so that we can be ready to see the opportunities God is giving us and ready to pray and act. Be aware that God equips us for the work he calls us to do. When we are aware that God is with us, we can be prepared for anything.
