Isaiah 32:14-18

Peace with Creation

Each year we mark the Season of Creation with churches around the world. You can see the logo on the left above, where the leaves of the tree make a map of the World. Each year there is also a theme, and this year it is 'Peace with Creation.' The logo for the theme represents the world as it is with the land scorched and trees barren, and the hope for the world to be growing and green. They are linked by the dove, remembering the story of Noah, the renewal of creation and the hope that comes through the working of God's Spirit.

The Bible passage which inspired the theme this year is Isaiah 32:14-18. It offers a picture of the collapse of society, with cities being deserted. God's Spirit can turn the desert into a fruitful field. Right relationships with God and the rest of creation will create a peaceful dwelling place.

The organisers add: "Creation will find peace when justice is restored. There is still hope and the expectation for a peaceful Earth. To hope in a biblical context does not mean to stand still and quiet, but to act, pray, change, and reconcile with Creation and the Creator in unity, metanoia (repentance), and solidarity."

Marking the Season of Creation is part of our commitment as an Eco Church. The Season takes us up to the feast of St Francis on 4th October, and our own Harvest Thanksgiving on 5th October.

Look out the window and appreciate creation that is around you (whatever the weather is doing). Pray that humanity may learn to live in peace with the rest of creation.

Harvest of Hope






In this session we will discover what autism is - and isn't, as well as exploring the importance of identity and community and the role we can all play in building a more inclusive society.
